

SEA TRIAL MARINA BERTHS

Terms and Conditions of Display:

1. Exhibitors are generally limited to one (1) berth only on the sea trial dock, subject to availability.
2. Each Exhibitor must nominate a qualified, licenced person to skipper the vessel.
3. Vessels over 9 metres must have a deckhand on board during sea trials.
4. Boarding a vessel intended for a sea trial is by Exhibitor invitation only.
5. Each Exhibitor will be issued with an official boarding pass. Exhibitors must distribute passes to invited guests for access to the sea trial dock.
6. Additional passengers are not permitted to board the vessel while on a sea trial.
7. The exchanging of passengers is not allowed while on a sea trial.
8. Any Exhibitor deemed to be using their vessel as a taxi service will forfeit their right to berth on the sea trial dock and will not be permitted to conduct sea trials in future years.
9. Each vessel will be allocated a reserved berth. Skippers must only use their allocated berth.
10. Skippers, deckhands and exhibitors must obey the instructions of the sea trial dock co-ordinator, harbour master and security staff at all times.
11. All vessels must comply with QLD Maritime Safety Regulations and be equipped with adequate mooring lines
12. Sea Trials may only be conducted during Boat Show hours. **All vessels must berth on the sea trial dock overnight.**
13. Display fees will be added to the Exhibitor's Boat Show account and are payable by 31 March, 2011.
14. Failure to abide with any of the above regulations will result in the Exhibitor forfeiting their access to the sea trial dock.
15. Each Sea Trial boat must produce a current comprehensive marine insurance policy including public liability cover no later than May 6th. The Exhibitor needs to check with the insurer that the policy covers any Sea Trial activities.
